

Logging in to the Dight 310 File Server

The class file server is a place where you can go to download resources for the class and submit assignments. We also provide students in this course a limited amount of space to store their work, if you desire. Of course, you may always use your own cloud storage such as Dropbox, Google Drive, etc.

Here are the instructions for accessing the file server:

From on-campus wired connections:

Windows: Use the Map Network Drive facility on your PC.

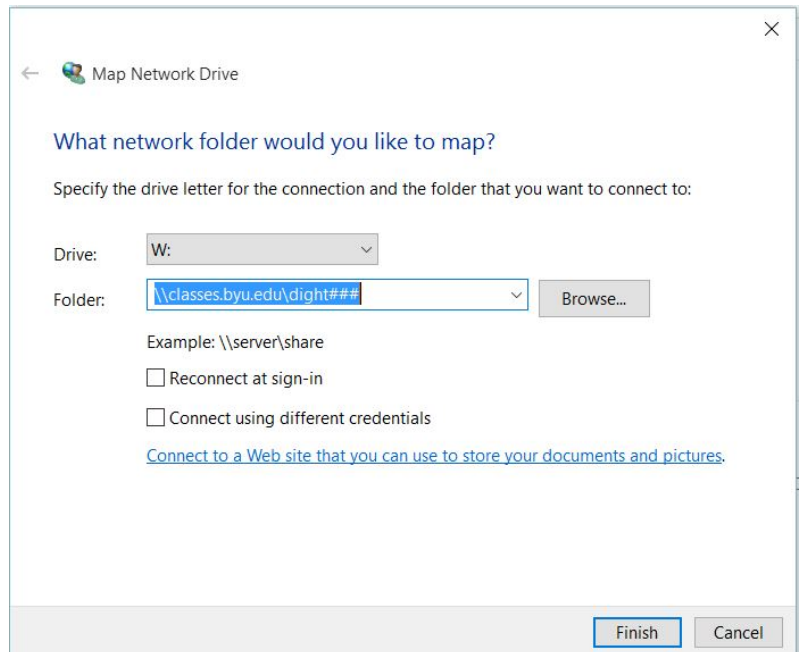
- Open a Windows Explorer window.
- Click on Computer.
- Click Map network drive at the top of the window

When mapping use the following syntax, replacing the "###" (in the screenshot at right) with the course number.

Example:

`\\classes.byu.edu\dight310`

If asked for a name and password, use your net id and password.



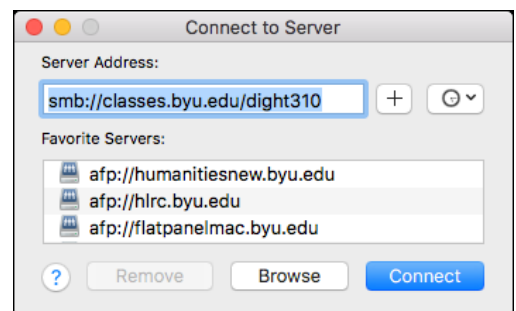
From on-campus wired connections:

Mac: To connect:

- Choose Go menu > Connect to Server in the Finder.
- In the connection dialog use the "smb" protocol

If asked for a name and password, use your net id and password.

Example: `smb://classes.byu.edu/dight310`



This works anywhere your web browser works, but no file upload capability:

Web: If all you need to do is view or download files you can use a web browser. Just use the URL <http://dight310.byu.edu>.

This is the best method from off campus or using WiFi on campus:

SFTP: You can also access the server using an SFTP client (such as Fetch or FileZilla for Mac, WinSCP or FileZilla for Windows) with the following settings:

Connection protocol: SFTP (not FTP)

Hostname: dight310.byu.edu

Username: BYU\your net id

Password: (your net id password)

Path or Initial folder: /var/share/class_space/dight310
